Promoting Disability Equality

This note contains the information to keep Members informed of matters relating to the work of the Committee, but where no decisions from Members are needed

1. Why has this come to scrutiny?

1.1 At the 9th June meeting of this committee, terms of reference for a review of promoting disability equality were agreed. The review group has now met three times. This information paper summarises progress to date.

2. Update on work programme

2.1 At the first meeting of the group, the following work programme was agreed as the basis of the review.

3. Other issues

- 3.1 As the new code of practice places a statutory duty on the council to prepare a three year disability equality scheme by December 2006, this needs to be included as part of the council's business planning programme for 2006/07.
- 3.2 As part of the business planning process, all new initiatives have to be assessed using the 'priorities assessment tool' which helps align projects to the corporate priorities. To enable the inclusion of the 'promoting disability equality' project, the review group used the tool to assess the linkages with the council's priority areas. The exercise was most helpful and the group were able to identify a number of areas where more work is needed.

Housing:

 There is a need to ensure that wherever possible, new housing units are built to lifetime homes standards

Crime:

- Need to consult with disabled community to assess their fears and perceptions on crime
- Need to ensure that hate crimes impacting on disabled people are considered as part of the SARA plan

Environment:

- The council should be consulting more widely with disabled people in the design and layout of environmental improvement projects. This might be in relation to pedestrianisation, cycle paths, dropped kerbs, lighting and signage.
- There is a particular issue around quality of paving finishes and faulty paving slabs which are potentially dangerous for disabled people
- Need to encourage more disabled people to recycle
- There are opportunities for the council to promote energy efficiency projects for disabled people

Transport

- There are opportunities to further improve disabled access to public transport
- More off-road cycle paths needed they provide safe routes for disabled people in wheelchairs / electric buggies
- More suitable disabled parking provision and enforcement is needed
- Taxi vouchers are inadequate there is an opportunity to provide a more equitable system for disabled people

Community

- Need to ensure that the emerging regeneration strategy explores the link between deprivation and disability and puts an action plan together
- Specific support is needed for the disability forum if it is to support the council in taking forward its disability equality duty
- More specific work on health and learning inequalities faced by disabled people needed

Culture

- There are more opportunities for the council to improve cultural related service delivery for disabled people
- In terms of tourism, a key weakness is access to the TIC which is very poor for disabled people
- Need to ensure that the emerging economic development strategy encourages employers to recruit, train and retain disabled employees.
- Need to ensure that leisure@ is fully accessible for disabled people, in particular looking at charging rates / availability of hoists and effectiveness of loop system
- Need to look at opportunities for outreach provision from art gallery and museum to

work with disabled community

 Need to ensure that disabled young people are given the opportunity to participate in council activities

Excellence

- More work needed from HR on tackling disability issues, particularly through improving recruitment procedures and rolling out training programmes
- More needed to promote positive images of disability in all our communications
- There is a need to link sustainability and disability issues

4. Next Steps

4.1 The review group will meet with Cheltenham Disability Forum on 11th January 2006 to agree the key service areas that the review will look at.
