### MOTION TO SOCIAL AND COMMUNITY OVERVIEW AND SCRUTINY SCHEDULED FOR 10<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER 2007.

S&C notes the Cabinet decision of 17<sup>th</sup> April to pursue a twin track approach looking at both enhanced partnership working and the contract approach regarding the issue of advice delivery in Cheltenham. Despite this, O&S notes that at its meeting of 18<sup>th</sup> July, Cabinet considered the contract option only.

# S&C therefore condemns the decision by the Cabinet to ignore the recommendation of the O&S report and its own resolution passed on 17<sup>th</sup> April.

S&C notes that the contract will be limited to housing, benefits and debt and that other forms of advice will **not** be delivered in future including Consumer issues; Employment issues; Health issues; Immigration; Tax; Relationship breakdown; Travel; Utilities and so on **even if the CAB win the current contract.** 

### S&C condemns this decision because it will substantially reduce the availability of advice for the people of Cheltenham.

S&C notes the resolution at Full Council on 28<sup>th</sup> June at which a majority of Councillors voted to urge the Cabinet to include the broad range of advice in any contract.

#### S&C condemns the decision to ignore the Full Council resolution.

S&C notes the failure of the Chair of O&S to represent the position of the committee to the Cabinet on 17<sup>th</sup> April, and her failure to raise any objection to the Cabinet refusing to consider the O&S working party report advocating the partnership option at its meeting of 18<sup>th</sup> July, and reminds her of the scrutiny role of O&S, and the need for the Chair to represent its findings rather than her own opinions.

## S&C resolves that it therefore has no confidence in her as Chair of O&S and requests that next full Council scheduled for 8<sup>th</sup> October remove her from the position and appoint a new Chairperson.

S&C notes that its recommendations to the Cabinet have been ignored and therefore resolves to dedicate its next full meeting scheduled for 15<sup>th</sup> October to examine this and the implications of the policy accepted by the Cabinet on 18<sup>th</sup> July.
