The Cruiser Activity Working Group Chaired by Inspector Andy Poole, Town Centre INA Inspector, comprising of council officers, elected members and police officers, continue to meet on a regular basis to deal with and put interventions in place to reduce issues relating to the anti-social use of motor vehicles within the borough but predominately those using and racing around the inner ring road especially on a Sunday evening. While this work continues, enforcement action is taken every weekend over the spring, summer and autumn periods by town centre officers supported by road policing units based at Bamfurlong on a Sunday evening. Drivers of offending vehicles are reported for speeding, construction and use offences and on appropriate occasions seized under Section 59 procedures.

Police have carried out at least two surveys to help paint a picture of the speeding and volume of vehicles issues in the town centre and to date approximately 65 prosecutions/Penalty Notices have been authorised/issued through police operations with arrangements in place to record by video such anti-social use of motor vehicles for future reference.

Inspector Andy Poole has indicated a willingness to attend a future Overview & Scrutiny Committee to fully update members on the activity as outlined above.
