#### **Report of the Leader of the Council**

#### **1. Executive Summary and recommendation**

##### **1.1 The issue**

- Promoting a strong and sustainable economy;
- Building healthy communities and supporting older people;
- Building stronger communities and supporting housing choice;
- A focus on children and young people;
- Investing in environmental quality;
- Investing in travel and transport; and
- Investing in arts and culture.

**2.2** Along with the nine community aims, we had an aim to focus our internal work:

- Being an excellent, efficient and sustainable council.

- Progress against business plan indicators
