The post is commonly referred to as the Chief Finance Officer/ Section 151 Officer. As required by the Council's Constitution, the appointment of this officer (interim or permanent) is to be made by Council. 2.3 Following an interview process conducted by the Chief Executive and Leader of the Council, it is recommended that Adele Taylor is appointed as Interim Section 151 Officer from January 2026.

requirements. Failure to do so creates a risk to the council in terms of its financial decision making.
