To implement Cabinet resolution of 15 July 2014 "Review of Licensing Policy, Guidance and Conditions for Private Hire and Taxis" delegating authority "to the Director of Environmental & Regulatory Services, in consultation with the Cabinet Member of Development and Safety, to approve a colour and an implementation date for the uniform colour scheme policy following the further consultation."

The Council can choose not to approve a uniform colour but since the Council has already adopted this policy in principle this is not a realistic alternative option.

	In total 163 responses were received, 162 from licensed Hackney Carria drivers and 1 from a Private Hire driver. The 162 responses represent 5 of the licensed Hackney Carriage trade of which there is currently a total 282 licensed Hackney Carriage drivers.								
	There was an overwhelming 95% (154) of respondents who were in supported of silver with 1% (2) preferring white and only 1 respondent opting for black. The remaining number of respondents did not indicate any preference.								
	In terms of the proposed implementation date, only 4 respondents disagreed with the proposed three months lead time for the uniform colour policy implementation.
