Dear Sir,

We are resending our objection because the first copy gave an incorrect address for 131 and it was pointed out that could invalidate our objection.

We would like to object most strongly to the Licensing Application for 129 - 131 The Promenade Cheltenham.

The noise already from these premises is intrusive to us inside our apartment when they have music outside, late at night particularly. We are not allowed double glazing and it would seem to be unfair to allow late night drinking as suggested in what is, after all, a residential area as well as a commercial area.

The Queens Hotel respect the fact that we actually live here and we have no problem with them but 131 seem unaware of the fact that they cause us a disturbance. The noise from their premises resounds around Imperial Square and the fact that they have a license to serve alcohol until so late is horrific. Considering that they have accommodation themselves to rent it would seem a problem to their guests as well.

We have experienced the lack of consideration for their neighbours first hand and although the big problem is loud, often late night music outside that is fuelled by the availability of alcohol which we would like to be restricted.

We feel that they have applied for a license until so late at night hoping they might get somewhere near that, but we would urge you consider whether with all the other establishments in the town whether it is necessary.


Everybody is entitled to open and run a business and we wish them well but consideration for your neighbours should be a priority. The Queens Hotel have recognised that and are good neighbours.

Re: Licensing Application 17/01399/PRMV (129-131 The Promenade)

Dear Mr Cooper,

We live at 32 Imperial Square, Cheltenham and object to the Application on two grounds:

- 1. The increase in hours (from 2.00 to 3.00 on Thurs Sat/Sun) during which alcohol and late night refreshment can be served will increase the noise level late at night for residents in the area. Disturbance is already at an unacceptable level with the current 2.00am deadline granting a licence which extends the hours to 03.00 will inevitably make things worse.
- 2. The increase in hours (from 00.00 to 03.00 On Thurs Sat) for the performance of recorded music may allow music to emit from the premises and consequently disturb the residents in the area. The current midnight deadline may be reasonable but an extension to 3am is too far into the night to be considered reasonable.

Both these objections are all the greater if the alcohol/music is served/played outside the building.
