We are writing with regard to the the application by Philip Vickery for the sale of alcohol and live and recorded music, (from Monday -Sunday 8 am - 11 pm and also 2 am) at 12 Royal Crescent, Cheltenham, GL50 3DA.

We own number 2 Royal Crescent and live there with our children, aged between 10 and 19.

We would like to ask that this licence isn't permitted for a number of reasons:

There are several residential properties on the Crescent and among all the families that live here there are a total of 9 children including a new born. Having a live music venue that sells alcohol is something that concerns us. Having alcohol for sale everyday is something that will bring people onto the Crescent and no doubt also result in anti-social behaviour and unwelcome noise.

The council has given permission for part of the Crescent now to be residential housing and having a live and recorded music venue is inappropriate, will be disruptive and a public nuisance.

The houses on the Royal Crescent are all single glazed as they are Grade II listed and therefore will not be able to prevent any noise disturbance from rowdy behaviour and live and recorded music.

This type of application would seem to be appropriate for a town centre, night club area, of which the Royal Crescent is not.
