M Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 9)

- 1. The premises licence will only be operated as a bowling alley/competitive socialising venue
- 2. There shall be no dancefloor.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- 3. CCTV shall be in use at the premises.
- (i) The CCTV equipment shall be maintained in good working order and continually record when licensable activity takes place and for a period of two hours afterwards.
- (ii) The premises licence holder shall ensure images from the CCTV are retained for a period of 31 days. This image retention period may be reviewed as appropriate by the Licensing Authority.
- (iii) The correct time and date will be generated onto both the recording and the real time image screen.
- (iv) If the CCTV equipment (Including any mobile units in use at the premises) breaks down the Premises Licence Holder shall ensure the designated premises supervisor, or in his/her absence other responsible person, verbally informs the Licensing Authority and the Police as soon as is reasonably practicable. This information shall be contemporaneously recorded in the incident report register and shall include the time, date and means this was done and to whom the information was reported. Equipment failures shall be repaired or replaced as soon as is reasonably practicable and without undue delay. The Licensing Authority and the Police shall be informed when faults are rectified.
- (v) The premises Licence holder shall ensure that there are trained members of staff available during licensable hours to be able to reproduce and download CCTV images into a removable format at the justified request of an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable.
- (vi) There shall be clear signage indicating that CCTV equipment is in use and recording at the premises.
 - 4. There will be a minimum of two SIA registered Door Supervisors from 20:00hrs on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays before Bank Holidays.
 - 5. At all other times, SIA registered Door Supervisors will be employed at the premises in accordance with a written risk assessment carried out by the premises. A copy of the risk assessment shall be kept on the premises and made available to the police and other responsible authorities on request.
 - 6. The premises licence holder shall ensure that the following details for each door supervisor are entered into a bound register kept for that purpose to include the following details:
 - (i) Name
 - (ii) Date of birth
 - (iii) Address
 - (iv) Contact telephone numbers
 - (iv) SIA Certificate number, or registration number of any accreditation scheme recognised by the Licensing Authority.
 - (v) Commencement date of performing duties at the premises.
 - (vi) The full details of any agency through which they have been allocated to work at the premises if appropriate
 - These details should be easily accessible to any authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable.
 - 7. The Premises Licence Holder shall require the Designated Premises Supervisor, or in his/ her absence other responsible person, to keep an "Incident report register" in a bound book, in which

full details of all incidents are recorded. This shall be completed as soon as possible and in any case no later than the close of business on the day of the incident. The time and date when the report was completed, and by whom, is to form part of the entry. The register is to be kept on the premises at all times and shall be produced to an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable when required.

- 8. An incident report logbook shall be held at the premises at all times and shall be produced to an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable immediately upon request. It shall contain the details of persons involved, incident description, time and date, actions taken and final outcome of the situation.
- 9. The premises holder shall ensure that the premises are a member of any locally operating Pub Watch scheme.
- 10. The premises shall be cleared of customers within 30 minutes of the last supply of alcohol on any day.
- 11. All staff are to be trained with respect to underage sales, such training to be updated as necessary when legislation changes and should include training in how to refuse sales to difficult customers.

c) Public safety

- 12. The Licensee shall ensure that any bottles or glasses are removed from persons leaving the premises.
- 13. Members of the public will be prevented from accessing hot food and drink preparation areas to prevent risks of scalds and burns to them.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- 14. Amplified music shall not be played at a level that will cause unreasonable disturbance to the occupants of any properties in the vicinity.
- 15. No speakers for amplification of music shall be placed on the outside of the premises or on the outside of any building forming a part of the premises.
- 16. Noise from any ventilation, refrigeration or air conditioning plant or equipment shall not cause nuisance to the occupants of any properties in the vicinity.
- 17. Signs shall be prominently displayed at the premises requesting that patrons respect local residents and leave the premises quietly.
- 18. The premises licence holder shall ensure that adequate measures are in place to prevent the escape of odours from the premises. This includes odour from food preparation and refuse storage.

e) The protection of children from harm

- 19. No Persons under the age of 18 permitted on the premises without a responsible adult.
- 20. No persons under the age of 18 permitted on the premises after 20:00hrs.
- 21. An approved proof of age scheme shall be adopted, implemented and advertised within the premise such as "Challenge 25" whereby an accepted form of photographic identification shall be requested before any alcohol is sold to any person who appears to be under 25 years of age. Acceptable proof of age shall include identification bearing the customers photograph, date of birth and integral

holographic mark or security measure. Suitable means of identification would include PASS approved proof of age card, photo-card driving licence and passport.

22. Publicity materials notifying customers of the operation of the Challenge 25 scheme shall be displayed at the premises, including a Challenge 25 sign of at least A5 size at the entrance to the premises and where practicable at each point of sale.
