I am a resident				<p>Using the data you have provided, it seems alcohol was and still is not an issue at all. Please remove this from the bill as it is otherwise 100% just an overstep in blocking people's freedom when your own evidence proves it's completely unrelated and unnecessary.</p>
I am a resident				<p>I feel it's important to be able to be proactive in preventing an escalation of antisocial behaviour in town in order to ensure that the town centre remains a safe and attractive space to both residents and visitors. I've noticed an increase in low level ASB in the centre of town, particularly around the "pocket park" near Boots Corner and the alleyway next to Boots. Even in the daytime it's quite intimidating when it happens and makes me want to avoid walking in that area and certainly avoid walking on that side of the road.</p> <p>The other main issue is that of graffiti - it's becoming endemic not just in the town centre but also spreading outwards into residential areas. If this isn't tackled and nipped in the bud the town will become an eyesore. I have often overheard visitors to town from other places comment on how run down it looks compared to the last time they visited.</p>

I am a resident				<p>The number of fines issued for dog related incidents is a tiny proportional of the number of reported events. As a keen runner I am fed up of being chased and sometimes bitten by dogs. I work as a volunteer for Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust and am appalled at the behaviour of dog owners at their nature reserves. How are existing dog laws being policed? Massive improvement is needed on this topic.</p>
